

The Ministry of MSMEs Implements the MSME Champions Scheme

On 15th December 2022, the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) issued a notification bearing the subject "Sustainable Business Model" that implemented the MSME Champions Scheme. The Objective is for modernising MSMEs' manufacturing processes, reducing wastages, encouraging innovativeness, sharpening business competitiveness along with facilitating their National and International reach and excellence. Numerous financial incentives and provided to MSMEs under the particular Scheme. Under the MSME Champions Scheme, there are three components which are as follows -

- MSME Sustainable (ZED)
- MSME Competitive (Lean)
- MSME Innovative (Incubation, IPR, Design and Digital MSME)

The MSMEs registered under the MSME Sustainable (ZED) Certification Scheme have gained benefits by assessing different parameters, i.e., Bronze, Silver and Gold Certification Levels. This Scheme is based on the assessment model that includes multiple parameters that encourage MSMEs to improve their processes and systems that enhance quality and move towards sustainability. Certain parameters for encouraging MSMEs to adopt practices towards sustainability are Environment Management, Natural Resource Management, Energy Management, Corporate Social Responsibility, etc.

The MSME Sustainable (ZED) Certification Scheme was launched on 28th April 2022, where more than 22,000 MSMEs have registered, from which 734 Bronze, 32 Silver and 25 Gold Certifications have been granted to MSMEs to date along with the remaining under process for certification that is subject to the fulfilment of the assessment criteria.
